Silver Bells & the Season of Giving

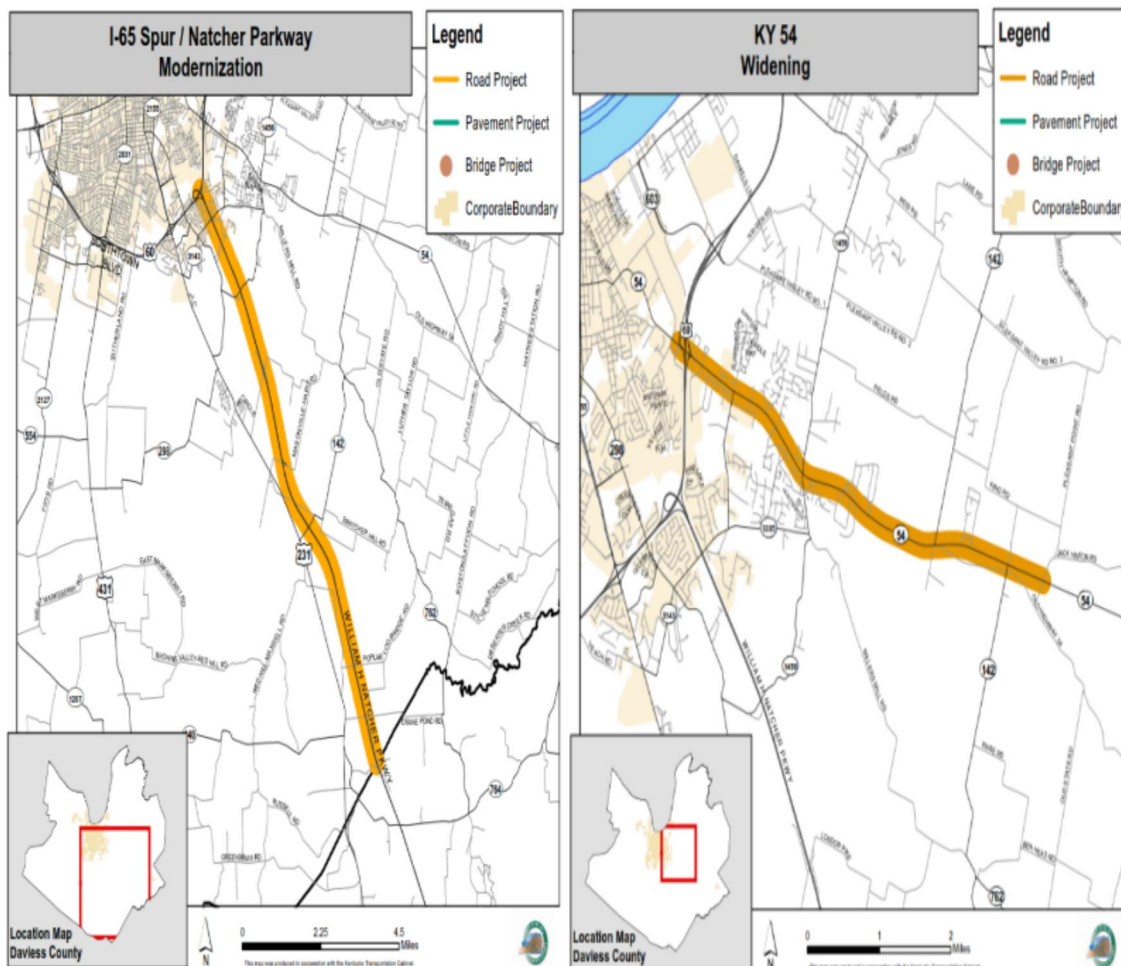
The District Long Term Care Ombudsman Program invites individuals and organizations in the GRADD area to contribute to the 2018 Silver Bells project.

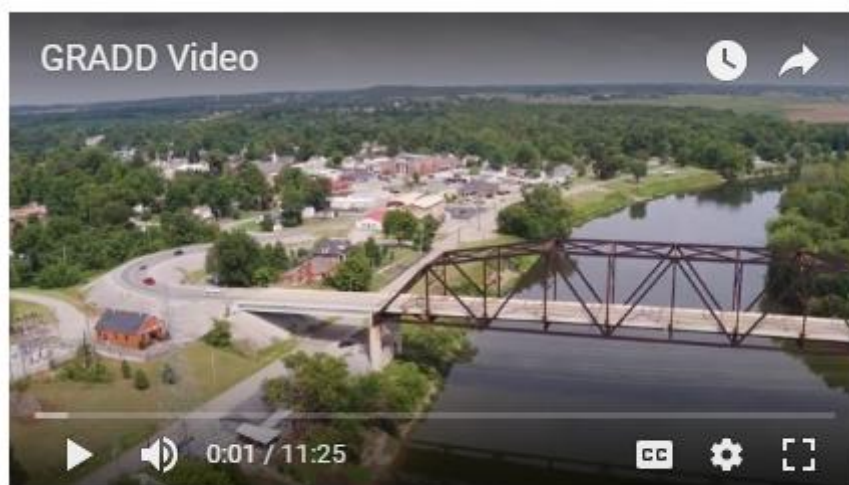


The GRADD Office will be closed Monday December 31st and Tuesday January 1st.

 - **Owensboro** was selected for the **Joe Ford Nature Trail Improvements** for \$23,315. These funds will be used for outlining of the Joe Ford Nature Trail using lumber
 - **Livermore** was selected for the **Livermore Riverwalk** for \$41,392. These funds will be used to extend the Riverwalk all the way to the RV Park, completing the Riverwalk Trail and encompassing Livermore's recreational amenities downtown.
