A delegation from GRADD attended the ceremony held at Stryker Logistics in Bowling Green.

The Interstate 165 project updated 70-plus miles of the William H. Natcher Parkway to an interstate spur between Bowling Green and Owensboro. The project was announced by Gov. Matt Bevin and U.S. Rep. Brett Guthrie in August 2016. Kentucky Transportation Cabinet Secretary Greg Thomas announced in September 2018 an agreement with the Federal Highway Administration to officially designate the Natcher Parkway as I-165. The upgrading of Natcher Parkway to I-165 represents an investment of more than \$40 million in modernization construction.

Communities along the corridor can now use the economic driving force of being located on an interstate to unlock economic development potential. In addition to the economic development factors, safety upgrades are also a major part of this project. Three "toll booth plaza" interchanges will be reconstructed to diamond shaped interchanges. One of which is located in Hartford.

The signing of the newly designated interstate spur started in March 2019 with a \$1.5 million contract. The project to complete the temporary signing of I-165 is expected to be completed in the next several weeks. The permanent signs are expected to be in place by early June.

The Green River Mental Health and Aging Coalition offered Mental Health First Aid training to a full house at the GRADD office on Thursday, March 28. Fifty-one people were trained. The training was made possible by a grant from the Kentucky Mental Health and Aging Coalition and in partnership with River Valley Behavioral Health. The training was presented by River Valley Behavior Health staff, Dr. Lionel Phelps, Vice President for Continuous Quality Improvement and Dr. RonSonlyn Clark, Senior Director of Substance Abuse Treatment and Prevention.

Mental Health First Aid is an 8-hour course that teaches how to identify, understand and respond to signs of mental illnesses and substance use disorders. The training gives participants the skills needed to reach out and provide initial help and support to someone who may be developing a mental health or substance use problem or experiencing a crisis.



They received \$910,827 in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds for their Sanitary Sewer Replacement project. The federal funds will allow the city to replace 8,900 linear feet of existing clay pipe, manholes and appurtenances, as well as add new PVC line to serve four new customers.

The pipes currently in place were installed in 1964 and have surpassed their intended
