Past Issues

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Commissioner Sandra Dunahoo from the Department for Local Government visited several GRADD communities on October 28th, and October 29th. The reason for her visit was to announce several project funding announcements. They are as follows:

- City of Whitesville received \$541,250 in Community Development Block Grant funds for the Whitesville Wastewater Treatment Plant;
- City of Whitesville also received \$28,000 in Recreational Trail Grant funding for the repaying of the Whitesville Park Community Trail;
- Daviess County received \$75,000 for inclusive playground equipment;
- City of Lewisport received \$500,000 for the construction of a new 8,450 square foot public library; and
- City of Livermore received \$500,000 in Community Development Block Grant funds for the renovation of the fire station facility.

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Over 500 Seniors Benefited from Food Drive

With a collection period of over a month, the Feed Seniors Now Food Drive delivered groceries to over 500 seniors in Daviess, Hancock, Henderson, McLean, Ohio, and Webster Counties on Tuesday, October 22, 2019.

During the collection period, GRADD social workers have taken referrals for seniors in the area who struggle with food insecurity. The ability to provide some relief to local seniors is possible through the partnership of Independence Bank, Comfort Keepers, Kentucky Legend® (a division of Specialty Foods Group, LLC), Canteen, and the Green River Area Development District (GRADD). In addition to these partners who organize the food drive, local grocery stores played a vital role by being collection sites.

Amber Phelps, GRADD In-Home Services Manager says, "While the food drive provides temporary relief for the recipients, it is our hope that by continuing the annual food drive, individuals will become more aware of the issue of food insecurity among seniors. With greater awareness, there can be more collaboration for a long-term solution."

"Providing a week's worth of groceries to such a large number of seniors, located over a six-county area requires a lot of coordination behind the scenes. All of those efforts are rewarded when the groceries are delivered. The seniors who receive the delivery are very grateful, and everyone involved comes away with a new perspective on what it means to help the vulnerable in our communities," states Jennifer Williams, Associate Director for Social Services, GRADD.

There were 12 employers in attendance looking to fill positions.





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The 2019 Update to <u>GRADD's Comprehensive Economic Development</u> <u>Strategy (CEDS)</u> has been completed and published. The CEDS is a regional economic development planning document designed to help a region create a strategy for economic prosperity and resilience. The U.S. Economic Development Administration requires an update annually and a completely new document and planning process every five years. The 2019 Update is part of GRADD's 2017-2021 CEDS. Updates include new data, enhanced readability,

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While ConnectGRADD upgrades are continuing, the project has added plans for new areas as the Hopkins County Fiscal Court voted this month to join ConnectGRADD Inc. to expand rural broadband access into underserved parts of Hopkins County. Exact sites and a buildout schedule are currently being finalized, with work to extend the ConnectGRADD network into northern Hopkins County expected to begin before the end of the year.

This Hopkins County expansion will not only add new service areas under the ConnectGRADD umbrella but will also bolster the existing network, as the initial plans include additional backhaul path upgrades to add more bandwidth availability to the southern portions of the current ConnectGRADD network.
