**I. CALL TO ORDER**

Chairman Steve Henry called the meeting to order at 9:05 a.m. He welcomed everyone to the meeting and thanked Representatives Suzanne Miles and Jim Gooch for joining today's meeting. Chairman Henry introduced the new citizen's representative to the committee, Larry Tellman and asked him to tell the committee a little about himself. He also recognized Judge/Executives Curtis Dame and Al Mattingly.

**II. CONSIDERATION OF MINUTES**

Chairman Henry offered the minutes of the May 31, 2022, meeting of the GRADD Regional Transportation Committee for approval.

A motion was made by Jimmy VanCleve and seconded by Donnie Mayton to approve the minutes of the May 31, 2022, GRADD Regional Transportation Committee meeting.  
A vote was taken and the motion carried.

**III. OLD BUSINESS**

**A. Regional Transportation Committee Membership Update**

Chairman Henry provided an update concerning the committee membership. Larry Tellman, already introduced, will fill the citizen representative vacancy. The committee hopes to fill the human services vacancy with someone from Audubon Area. He welcomed Gina Boaz back as the transportation planner after the departure of Max Gee. She will step in as transportation planner while continuing her duties as economic development specialist.

**IV. NEW BUSINESS**

**A. Safe Streets for All**

Chairman Henry introduced Adam Kirk from the UK Transportation Center to share with the committee information about the grant program. Safe Streets for All (SS4A) is a discretionary program with \$5 billion in appropriated funds over the next five years. For FY22, up to \$1 billion is available for regional, local and Tribal initiatives to prevent roadway deaths and serious injuries. Chairman Henry apologized to the committee, but due to time constraints, the GRADD board approved the application for SS4A at their August meeting without prior approval from this committee. Tom Lovett asked each GRADD community to provide a letter of support for the application by September 15, 2022. Henderson County may apply for funding on their own, but they are welcome to be part of the GRADD application. If the application gets approved, and a plan is completed, specific road projects will be addressed in every county. GRADD will do public outreach, UK will provide the data needed for the application.

**B. GRADD Community Economic Development Strategy**

Chairman Henry introduced Jessie Howard, GRADD Public Administration Specialist and Special Projects Coordinator. She addressed the committee regarding the Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS). Ms. Howard shared every five years GRADD must re-write the CEDS to identify strengths and weaknesses in economic development in the region, along with strategies to continue to improve progress. In between those years, updates are written to address the strategies outlined in the CEDS. This year is a re-write year. She asked the committee for their input on any strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats from a transportation standpoint. Mike Baker shared Highway 60 is an ongoing issue in Hancock County. Despite the layoffs at Century Aluminum, it is still a major thoroughfare in the county, yet in many areas it has no shoulder. The need for lighting on the exits on 1-69 was discussed. Charlotte Whittaker brought up the need for improvements on 231 S out of Beaver Dam due to the new residential community planned there and a new battery facility in Bowling Green.

**C. FY23 Regional Goals and Objectives**

Gina Boaz presented the FY23 Regional Goals and Objectives of the GRADD Regional Transportation Committee for approval.

A motion was made by Curtis Dame and seconded by Jimmy VanCleve to approve the FY23 Goals and Objectives. A vote was taken and the motion carried.

**D. FY23 RTC By-laws**

Gina Boaz proposed the following change to Section 1. f. under Article III, Membership and Organization: A representative of human services delivery.

A motion was made by Charlotte Whittaker and seconded by Donnie Mayton to change Section 1 f. under Article III of the bylaws as outlined above. A vote was taken and the motion carried.

**E. FY23 Plan for Committee Activities**

Gina Boaz presented the FY23 Plan for Committee Activities of the GRADD Regional Transportation Committee for approval.

A motion was made by Mike Baker and seconded by Curtis Dame to approve the FY23 Plan for Committee Activities. A vote was taken and the motion carried.

**F. Nominating Committee**

Chairman Henry asked for volunteers to serve on the Nominating Committee to nominate officers for next year. Charlotte Whittaker, Judge Curtis Dame and Brian Howard volunteered to be on the committee.


