#### I. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Pete Conrad called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m., and noted there was a quorum. He suggested that everyone introduce themselves since there were new members of the council present.

#### II. OLD BUSINESS

#### A. Secretary's Report – January 22, 2019

Secretary Amanda Durham-Hayes presented the minutes of the January 22, 2019, meeting of the GRADD Water Management Council for approval. Barbara Spencer noted that she was marked as present at the January 22, 2019, meeting but was actually absent.

A motion was made by Les Piper and seconded by Jamie Harkins to approve the minutes of the January 22, 2019, meeting of the GRADD Water Management Council with the change of Barbara Spencer from present to absent. A vote was taken and the motion carried.

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#### III. <u>NEW BUSINESS</u>

#### A. <u>Guest Speakers</u>

Chairman Conrad introduced guest speakers Sonny Renfrow, former Mayor of the City of Livermore and Lance Wilson, Plant Operation of McLean County Regional Water Plant. Mr. Renfrow and Mr. Wilson explained the process of regionalizing the McLean County water system from DAWN (Driving Area Water Needs) to the newly constructed water plant that went on-line on March 22, 2018. Mr. Renfrow explained the various funding sources utilized for the project including Community Development Block Grant, USDA Rural Development grant and loan, and Kentucky Infrastructure Authority grant and loan. Mr. Renfrow noted that the collaboration between the Cities of Livermore, Island, Calhoun, and Sacramento with the McLean County Fiscal Court was the true driving force behind the McLean County Regional Water Plant project. At the conclusion of their presentation, time was allotted for a question and answer session.

#### B. <u>DRA Funding Opportunity</u>

Chairman Conrad called on Joanna Shake to present the possibilities for Delta Regional Authority funding. Ms. Shake discussed potential projects that could be funded by Delta Regional Authority grants and explained that basic public infrastructure was an identified category of funding through the States' Economic Development Assistance Program (SEDAP). Ms. Shake noted that if anyone would like to apply for DRA funding, to contact her at the GRADD office.

#### C. CDBG Public Facility Announcements

Chairman Conrad then called on Skyler Stewart to present recently funded Community Development Block Grant infrastructure projects in the GRADD region. Ms. Stewart explained that three communities were awarded funding through the CDBG process: the City of Sturgis was awarded \$567,042 for rehabilitation of their flood protection wall, the City of Sebree was awarded \$910,877 for replacement of 8,900 LF of clay sewer lines, and the City of Calhoun was awarded \$1,000,000 for rehabilitation of their wastewater treatment plant.

#### D. KIA Update

Skyler Stewart mentioned that the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority has gone through recent reorganization and Julie Bickers will now be the contact at KIA for the GRADD region. Ms. Stewart then showed charts depicting the SRF FY 2019 call for project water and sewer funding requests.

#### E. Open Discussion

Chairman Conrad then opened the floor for discussion. Secretary Amanda Durham-Hayes mentioned that Ohio County will be doing a distribution training at the Highway 136 office in Hartford on April 12 and 13.
